SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

This Settlement Agreement¹ is entered into between Plaintiffs for the above-styled action, on behalf of themselves and the Settlement Class, on the one hand, and Defendant, on the other hand. The Parties hereby agree to the following terms in full settlement of the Action, subject to a Final Approval Order entered by the Court.

I. Procedural History

1. Defendant is in the business of selling durable medical equipment and supplies with a focus on sleep apnea therapy. In the ordinary course of operating its healthcare business, Defendant collects, maintains, and stores Private Information pertaining to current and former patients and employees.

2. In late December 2024, Defendant became aware it was the victim of a cybersecurity incident that took place between December 13, 2024, and December 21, 2024,

wherein an unauthorized third party infiltrated its computer network, potentially impacting the Private Information of nearly 90,000 of Defendant's former and current patients and employees.

3. On or about August 15, 2025, Defendant began sending notification letters to those individuals whose Private Information may have been impacted in the Data Incident.

4. Following receipt of notice, four class-action complaints were filed in the United States District Court for the Middle District of Florida all seeking to represent a nationwide class of those individuals whose Private Information may have been impacted in the Data Incident.

5. Following motions for consolidation and appointment of lead counsel, the court consolidated the actions into the first-filed action and appointed Jeff Ostrow, Mariya Weekes, and Marc Edelson as interim co-lead class counsel.

6. Plaintiffs then filed a consolidated class action complaint; Defendant filed a motion to dismiss; and Plaintiffs filed a response in opposition. The Court denied the motion in part and granted it in part.

7. Following the ruling on the motion to dismiss, the Parties decided to conserve resources for the benefit of the Parties and the putative class and to explore early resolution. Before they began negotiating, Plaintiffs' Counsel consulted with damage and liability experts, propounded informal discovery requests on Defendant to which Defendant responded by providing information related to, among other things, the nature and cause of the Data Incident, the number and geographic location of victims potentially impacted by the Data Incident, and the specific type of information breached. Defendant also propounded informal discovery requests on Plaintiffs, and they responded with purported support for their allegations of actual fraud and mitigation of the risk of fraud following the Data Incident.

8. Following the information exchange, the Parties began negotiating the parameters

of a class-wide settlement. After a few weeks of arms-length negotiations, the Parties agreed to the terms of the Settlement on June 4, 2026. During their settlement discussions the Parties determined that jurisdiction was proper in state court. Consequently, they dismissed the federal action and filed the Complaint in this Action.

9. The Parties now agree to settle the Action entirely, without any admission of liability or wrongdoing, with respect to all Released Claims of the Releasing Parties. Defendant has entered into this Agreement to resolve all controversies and disputes arising out of or relating to the allegations made in the Complaint, and to avoid the litigation costs and expenses, distractions, burden, expense, and disruption to its business operations associated with further litigation. Defendant does not in any way acknowledge, admit to, or concede any of the allegations made in the Complaint, and expressly disclaims and denies any fault or liability, or any charges of wrongdoing that have been or could have been asserted in the Complaint. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be used or construed as an admission of liability, and this Agreement shall not be offered or received in evidence in any action or proceeding in any court or other forum as evidence, nor as an admission or concession, of liability or wrongdoing of any nature or for any other purpose other than to enforce the terms of this Agreement. Plaintiffs have entered into this Agreement to recover on the claims asserted in the Complaint, and to avoid the risk, delay, and uncertainty of continued litigation. Plaintiffs do not in any way concede that the claims alleged in the Complaint lack merit or are subject to any defenses. The Parties intend this Agreement to bind Plaintiffs, Defendant, and all Settlement Class Members.

NOW, THEREFORE, in light of the foregoing, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby mutually acknowledged, the Parties agree, subject to approval by the Court, as follows.

II. Definitions

10. “**Action**” means the consolidated class action lawsuit entitled: *Brett Conner v. CPAP Medical Supplies and Services, Inc.*, Case No. CACE-26-011830 (Fla. Cir. Ct., Broward Cnty.).

11. “**Agreement**” or “**Settlement Agreement**” or “**Settlement**” means this agreement between Plaintiffs and Defendant, including all exhibits.

12. “**Application for Attorneys’ Fees, Costs and Service Awards**” means the application made with the Motion for Final Approval seeking Class Counsel’s attorneys’ fees and costs, and service awards for the Class Representatives.

13. “**Cash Payment for Documented Losses**” means cash compensation of up to \$5,000.00 for each Settlement Class Member who submits a Valid Claim for documented out-of-pocket losses.

14. “**Claim**” means the submission of a Claim Form by a Claimant for Settlement Class Member Benefits.

15. “**Claim Form**” means the proof of claim, substantially in the form attached hereto as *Exhibit 4*.

16. “**Claim Form Deadline**” means 90 days following Notice Commencement.

17. “**Claimant**” means an individual who submits a Claim Form.

18. “**Claims Process**” means the process by which Claimants may submit Claim Forms online at the Settlement Website or by mail to the Settlement Administrator, including the procedure to approve or reject Claims.

19. “**Class Counsel**” means Jeff Ostrow of Kopelowitz Ostrow P.A. and Mariya Weekes of Milberg PLLC.

20. “**Class List**” means the list of Settlement Class Members’ full names, email addresses (if available), and postal addresses as reflected in Defendant’s records that the Defendant shall prepare and deliver to the Settlement Administrator.

21. “**Class Representatives**” means the Plaintiffs the Court approves as representatives of the Settlement Class.

22. “**Complaint**” means the Class Action Complaint filed by Plaintiffs in this Action.

23. “**Court**” means the Circuit Court for the Seventeenth Judicial Circuit in and for Broward County, FL and the Judge(s) assigned to the Action.

24. “**Data Incident**” means the cybersecurity incident involving the Defendant resulting in the potential unauthorized access to Settlement Class Members’ Private Information between December 13, 2024 and December 21, 2024.

25. “**Defendant**” means CPAP Medical Supplies and Services, Inc., the defendant in the action.

26. “**Defendant’s Counsel**” means Christopher S. Carver, Christian P. George, and Adam C. Remillard of Akerman LLP.

27. “**Effective Date**” means the day after the entry of the Final Approval Order, provided there are no objections to the Settlement. If there are objections to the Settlement, then the Effective Date shall be the later of: (a) 30 days after entry of the Final Approval Order if no appeals are taken from the Final Approval Order; or (b) if appeals are taken from the Final Approval Order, then the earlier of 30 days after the last appellate court ruling affirming the Final Approval Order or 30 days after the entry of a dismissal of the appeal.

28. “**Email Notice**” means the email notice of the Settlement, substantially in the form attached hereto as ***Exhibit I***, that the Settlement Administrator may distribute to Settlement Class

Members.

29. “**Final Approval**” means the final approval of the Settlement, which occurs when the Court enters the Final Approval Order.

30. “**Final Approval Hearing**” means the hearing held before the Court during which the Court will consider granting Final Approval of the Settlement and the Application for Attorneys’ Fees, Costs and Service Awards.

31. “**Final Approval Order**” means the order granting Final Approval of the Settlement, substantially in the form attached hereto as ***Exhibit 6***.

32. “**Long Form Notice**” means the long form notice of the Settlement, substantially in the form attached hereto as ***Exhibit 3***, that shall be posted on the Settlement Website and shall be available to Settlement Class members by mail on request made to the Settlement Administrator.

33. “**Medical Data Monitoring**” means CyEx LLC’s medical data monitoring product known as Medical Shield Complete consisting of two years of monitoring that Settlement Class Members may elect as a Settlement Class Member Benefit under the Settlement.

34. “**Motion for Final Approval**” means the motion that Plaintiffs and Class Counsel shall file with the Court seeking Final Approval of the Settlement, including Class Counsel’s Application for Attorneys’ Fees, Costs, and Service Awards.

35. “**Motion for Preliminary Approval**” means the motion that Plaintiffs shall file with the Court seeking Preliminary Approval of the Settlement.

36. “**Notice**” means the Email Notice, Postcard Notice, and Long Form Notice that Plaintiffs will ask the Court to approve in connection with the Motion for Preliminary Approval.

37. “**Notice Commencement**” means the date Notice is first sent to the Settlement

Class.

38. “**Notice Program**” means the methods provided for in this Agreement for giving Notice to the Settlement Class and consists of Email Notice, Postcard Notice, Long Form Notice, the Settlement Website, and the Settlement Class toll-free telephone number.

39. “**Notice of Deficiency**” means the notice sent by the Settlement Administrator to a Settlement Class member who has submitted an invalid Claim.

40. “**Objection Deadline**” means 30 days before the initial scheduled Final Approval Hearing.

41. “**Opt-Out Deadline**” means 30 days before the initial scheduled Final Approval Hearing.

42. “**Party**” means each of the Plaintiffs and Defendant, and “**Parties**” means Plaintiffs and Defendant, collectively.

43. “**Plaintiffs**” mean Brett Conner, Juwan Overshown, Diane Edwards, Stephen Follett, Roderic Woods, John Crist, Chris Harriman, and Tyrone Woods, the plaintiffs in this Action.

44. “**Postcard Notice**” means the Postcard Notice of the Settlement, substantially in the form attached hereto as ***Exhibit 2***, that the Settlement Administrator may distribute to Settlement Class members.

45. “**Preliminary Approval**” means the preliminary approval of the Settlement, which occurs when the Court enters the Preliminary Approval Order, substantially in the form attached to the Motion for Preliminary Approval.

46. “**Preliminary Approval Order**” means the order preliminarily approving the Settlement and proposed Notice Program, substantially in the form attached hereto as ***Exhibit 5***.

47. **“Private Information”** means Settlement Class Members’ information that may have been impacted in the Data Incident, which includes some combination of their names, physical addresses, email addresses, telephone numbers, Social Security numbers, drivers’ license numbers, health insurance information, medical histories, treatment plans, and financial information.

48. **“Releases”** means the releases and waivers set forth in Section X of this Agreement.

49. **“Released Claims”** means any and all actual, potential, filed or unfiled, known or unknown, fixed or contingent, claimed or unclaimed, suspected or unsuspected claims, demands, liabilities, rights, causes of action, damages, punitive, exemplary or multiplied damages, expenses, costs, indemnities, attorneys’ fees and/or obligations, whether in law or in equity, accrued or unaccrued, direct, individual or representative, of every nature and description whatsoever, based on any federal, state, local, statutory or common law or any other law, against the Released Parties, or any of them, arising out of or relating to actual or alleged facts, transactions, events, matters, occurrences, acts, disclosures, statements, representations, omissions or failures to act relating to the Data Incident.

50. **“Released Parties”** means Defendant and each and every one of its past or present, affiliates, divisions, employees, servants, members, providers, partners, principals, directors, officers, and owners, and all of their respective attorneys, heirs, executors, administrators, insurers, coinsurers, reinsurers, joint ventures, personal representatives, predecessors, successors, transferees, trustees, authorized agents, and assigns, and includes, without limitation, any person related to any such entities who is, was, or could have been named as a defendant in the Action.

51. **“Releasing Parties”** means Plaintiffs and Settlement Class Members and their respective past, present, and future heirs, devisees, beneficiaries, conservators, executors, estates,

administrators, assigns, trustees, receivers, agents, attorneys, accountants, financial and other advisors, and any other representatives of any of these persons and entities.

52. **“Settlement Administrator”** means Simpluris, Inc. or “Simpluris”.

53. **“Service Awards”** means the payment that Class Counsel will request the Court approve for the Plaintiffs for serving as Class Representatives.

54. **“Settlement Administration Costs”** means all costs and fees of the Settlement Administrator regarding Notice and Settlement administration.

55. **“Settlement Class”** means all living individuals residing in the United States who were sent notice by Defendant that their Private Information may have been impacted in the Data Incident. Excluded from the Settlement Class are (a) all persons who are directors, officers, and agents of Defendant; (b) governmental entities; (c) the Judge assigned to the Action, that Judge’s immediate family, and Court staff; and (d) any Settlement Class Member who timely and properly opts out of the Settlement.

56. **“Settlement Class Member”** means any member of the Settlement Class.

57. **“Settlement Class Member Benefit”** means the Cash Payment for Documented Losses and Medical Data Monitoring that Settlement Class Members may Claim in the Settlement.

58. **“Settlement Website”** means the website the Settlement Administrator will establish as a means for the Settlement Class members to submit Claim Forms and obtain notice and information about the Settlement, including hyperlinked access to this Agreement, the Preliminary Approval Order, Long Form Notice, Claim Form, Motion for Final Approval and Application for Attorneys’ Fees, Costs, and Service Awards, and Final Approval Order, as well as other documents as the Parties agree to post or the Court orders posted. The Settlement Website shall remain online and operable for at least six months after Final Approval.

59. “**Valid Claim**” means a Claim Form submitted by a Settlement Class member that is: (a) submitted in accordance with the provisions of the Settlement; (b) accurately, fully, and truthfully completed and executed, with all of the information requested in the Claim Form, by a Settlement Class Member; (c) signed physically or by e-signature by a Settlement Class Member personally, subject to the penalty of perjury; (d) returned via mail and postmarked by the Claim Form Deadline, or, if submitted online, submitted by 11:59 p.m. Eastern time on the Claim Form Deadline; and (e) determined to be valid by the Settlement Administrator. A Claim Form may be approved in whole or in part, and the Settlement Administrator may approve one Settlement Class Member Benefit while denying or reducing another. The Settlement Administrator may require additional information from the Claimant to validate the Claim, including, but not limited to, answers related to questions regarding the validity or legitimacy of the physical or e-signature. Failure to respond to the Settlement Administrator’s Notice of Deficiency may result in a determination that the Claim is not a Valid Claim.

III. Settlement Class Member Benefits

60. Defendant shall be solely responsible for the payment of all Settlement Class Member Benefits to Settlement Class Members, all Settlement Administration Costs, and any Court-approved attorneys’ fees, costs, and Service Awards.

61. When submitting a Claim, Settlement Class Members may elect the Cash Payment and/or Medical Data Monitoring. If a Settlement Class Member opts out of the Settlement, he or she will not receive a Settlement Class Member Benefit. If a Settlement Class Member fails to submit a Claim, he or she will release his or her claim without receiving a Settlement Class Member Benefit.

a. Cash Payment for Documented Losses

Settlement Class Members may submit a Claim for a Cash Payment for up to \$5,000.00 each upon presentment of documented out-of-pocket losses related to fraud and/or identity theft as a result of the Data Incident. To receive a documented loss payment, a Settlement Class Member must elect the Cash Payment on the Claim Form attesting under penalty of perjury to being the victim of fraud and/or identity theft and incurring documenting losses. Settlement Class Members will be required to submit reasonable documentation supporting the losses. Documentation supporting the claim can include receipts or other documentation not “self-prepared” by the claimant that document the costs incurred. “Self-prepared” documents such as handwritten receipts are, by themselves, insufficient to receive reimbursement, but can be considered to add clarity or support other submitted documentation. Settlement Class Members shall not be reimbursed for expenses if they have been reimbursed for the same expenses by another source, including compensation provided in connection with the identity protection and Credit Monitoring services offered as part of the notification letter provided by Defendant or otherwise. There will be a maximum of \$500,000.00 payable by the Defendant for this benefit. In the event the total dollar amount of all Valid Claims for this benefit exceed that amount, Settlement Class Members’ distribution amounts will be reduced *pro rata*. If a Settlement Class Member does not submit reasonable documentation supporting a loss, or if their Claim is rejected by the Settlement Administrator for any reason, and the Settlement Class Member fails to cure his or her Claim, the Claim will be rejected.

b. Medical Data Monitoring

In addition to a Cash Payment for Documented Losses, all Settlement Class Members may submit a Claim for two years of CyEx’s Medical Shield Complete. The monitoring will be with one credit bureau and the service will include \$1,000,000.00 of identity theft insurance with no

deductible. Additional detail describing the product's features may be found at www.cyex.com/medical-shield.com.

62. **Settlement Administration Costs** - Defendant shall enter into a separate agreement with the Settlement Administrator for the payment of all costs associated with notice and administration. The maximum Defendant will pay for Settlement Administration Costs and Medical Data Monitoring shall be \$60,000.00.

63. **Remedial Measures / Security Enhancements** – Within 30 days of Preliminary Approval, Defendant will provide Class Counsel with a confidential declaration describing the remedial measures and security enhancements the Defendant implemented following the Data Incident and the filing of the lawsuits.

IV. Settlement Approval

64. Within five days of signing this Agreement, Plaintiffs will file their Motion for Preliminary Approval. The Motion for Preliminary Approval shall, among other things, request the Court: (1) preliminarily approve the terms of the Settlement as being within the range of fair, adequate, and reasonable; (2) provisionally certify the Settlement Class for settlement purposes only; (3) approve Simpluris as the Settlement Administrator; (4) approve the Notice Program set forth herein and the form and content of the Notices of the Settlement; (5) approve the Claim Process set forth herein and the form and content of the Claim Form; (6) approve the procedures for Settlement Class Members to opt out of the Settlement or for Settlement Class Members to object to the Settlement; (7) appoint Plaintiffs as Class Representatives; (8) appoint Jeff Ostrow and Mariya Weekes as Class Counsel; (8) stay the Action pending Final Approval of the Settlement; and (9) schedule a Final Approval Hearing for a time and date mutually convenient for the Court, the Parties, Class Counsel, and Defendant's Counsel.

V. Settlement Administrator

65. The Parties agree that, subject to Court approval, Simpluris shall be the Settlement Administrator. The Parties shall jointly oversee the Settlement Administrator. The Settlement Administrator shall fulfill the requirements set forth in the Preliminary Approval Order and the Agreement and comply with all applicable laws, including, but not limited to, the Due Process Clauses of the United States Constitution and the constitution of the State of Florida.

66. The Settlement Administrator shall administer various aspects of the Settlement as described in the next paragraph and perform such other functions as are specified for the Settlement Administrator elsewhere in this Agreement, including, but not limited to, effectuating the Notice Program, handling the Claims Process, and ensuring the distribution of Settlement Class Member Benefits.

67. The Settlement Administrator's duties include:

- a. Establishing and maintaining a post office box to receive opt-out requests from the Settlement Class, objections from Settlement Class members, and Claim Forms;
- b. Establishing and maintaining the Settlement Website to provide important information and to receive electronic Claim Forms;
- c. Establishing and maintaining an automated toll-free telephone line for Settlement Class Members to call with Settlement-related inquiries, and answering the frequently asked questions of Settlement Class Members who call with or otherwise communicate such inquiries;
- d. Responding to any mailed Settlement Class Member inquiries;
- e. Processing all opt-out requests from the Settlement Class;
- f. Providing weekly reports to Class Counsel and Defendant's Counsel that

summarize the number of Claims submitted, Claims approved and rejected, Notices of Deficiency sent, opt-out requests and objections received that week, the total number of opt-out requests and objections received to date, and other pertinent information;

g. In advance of the Final Approval Hearing, preparing a declaration for the Parties confirming the Notice Program was completed in accordance with the terms of this Agreement and the Preliminary Approval Order, describing how the Notice Program was completed, indicating the number of Claim Forms received and the amount of each benefit claimed, providing the names of each Settlement Class Member who timely and properly requested to opt-out from the Settlement Class, indicating the number of objections received, and other information as may be necessary to allow the Parties to seek and obtain Final Approval;

h. Collecting from Defendant the cash necessary to pay Cash Payments, the costs of Medical Data Monitoring, and for all Settlement Administration Costs;

i. Distributing Cash Payments and Medical Data Monitoring activation codes to Settlement Class Members who submit Valid Claims; and

j. Any other Settlement administration function at the instruction of Class Counsel and Defendant's Counsel.

VI. Class List, Notice Program, Opt-Out Procedures, and Objection Procedures

68. Defendant will make available to Class Counsel and the Settlement Administrator the Class List no later than 10 days after entry of the Preliminary Approval Order.

69. The Settlement Administrator shall commence the Notice Program using the forms of Notice approved by the Court no later than 30 days following Preliminary Approval.

70. Email Notice shall be sent to all Settlement Class Members for whom an email address is included in the Class List. Postcards shall be sent to those Settlement Class Members

for whom email addresses are not included in the Class List. The Email Notice and Postcard Notice shall include, among other information: a description of the material terms of the Settlement; how to submit a Claim Form; the Claim Form Deadline; the Opt-Out Deadline for Settlement Class members to opt-out of the Settlement Class; the Objection Deadline for Settlement Class Members to object to the Settlement and/or the Application for Attorneys' Fees, Costs and Service Awards; the Final Approval Hearing date; and the Settlement Website address at which Settlement Class members may access this Agreement and other related documents and information. Class Counsel and Defendant's Counsel shall insert the correct dates and deadlines in the Notice before the Notice Program commences, based upon those dates and deadlines set by the Court in the Preliminary Approval Order. If the date or time for the Final Approval Hearing changes, the Settlement Administrator shall update the Settlement Website to reflect the new date. No additional notice to the Settlement Class is required if the date or time for the Final Approval Hearing changes.

71. The Settlement Administrator shall perform reasonable address traces for Postcard Notices that are returned as undeliverable. By way of example, a reasonable tracing procedure would be to run addresses of returned postcards through the Lexis/Nexis database that can be utilized for such purpose. No later than 45 days before the initial scheduled Final Approval Hearing, the Settlement Administrator shall complete the re-mailing of Postcard Notice to those Settlement Class members whose new addresses were identified as of that time through address traces.

72. The Settlement Administrator shall establish the Settlement Website no later than the day before Notice is first initiated. The Settlement Administrator shall ensure the Settlement Website makes available the Court-approved online Claim Form that can be submitted directly on the Settlement Website or in printable version that can be sent by U.S. Mail to the Settlement

Administrator.

73. The Long Form Notice also shall include a procedure for Settlement Class members to opt out of the Settlement Class, and it shall direct Settlement Class members to review the Long-Form Notice to obtain the opt-out instructions. A Settlement Class member may opt out of the Settlement Class at any time before the Opt-Out Deadline by mailing an opt-out request to the Settlement Administrator postmarked no later than the last day of the deadline. The opt-out request must be personally signed by the Settlement Class member and contain the requestor's name, address, telephone number, and email address (if any), and include the case name, case number, and a statement indicating a request to be excluded from the Settlement Class. Any Settlement Class Member who does not submit a timely and valid opt-out request shall be bound by the terms of this Agreement even if that Settlement Class Member does not submit a Valid Claim.

74. The Long-Form Notice also shall include a procedure for Settlement Class Members to object to the Settlement and/or the Application for Attorneys' Fees, Costs and Service Awards, and the Postcard Notice shall direct Settlement Class members to review the Long-Form Notice to obtain the objection instructions. Objections must be filed with the Court, and sent by U.S. Mail to Class Counsel, Defendant's Counsel, and the Settlement Administrator. For an objection to be considered by the Court, the relevant Settlement Class Member must submit the objection no later than the Objection Deadline, as specified in the Notice, and the relevant Settlement Class Member must not have excluded himself or herself from the Settlement Class. If submitted by mail, an objection shall be deemed to have been submitted when posted if received with a postmark date indicated on the envelope if mailed first-class postage prepaid. In other words, objections by mail postmarked later than the Objection Deadline are late and will not be considered by the Court. If submitted by courier (e.g., Federal Express), an objection shall be

deemed to have been submitted on the shipping date reflected on the shipping label.

75. For an objection to be considered by the Court, the objection must also set forth:

- a. The case name and case number;
- b. the objector's full name, mailing address, telephone number, and email address (if any);
- c. all grounds for the objection, accompanied by any legal support for the objection known to the objector or objector's counsel;
- d. the number of times the objector has objected to a class action settlement within the five years preceding the date that the objector files the objection, the caption of each case in which the objector has made such objection, and a copy of any orders related to or ruling upon the objector's prior objections that were issued by the trial and appellate courts in each listed case;
- e. the identity of all counsel who represent the objector, including any former or current counsel who may be entitled to compensation for any reason related to the objection to the Settlement and/or Application for Attorneys' Fees, Costs, and Service Awards;
- f. the number of times in which the objector's counsel and/or counsel's law firm have objected to a class action settlement within the five years preceding the date of the filed objection, the caption of each case in which counsel or the firm has made such objection and a copy of any orders related to or ruling upon counsel's or the counsel's law firm's prior objections that were issued by the trial and appellate courts in each listed case in which the objector's counsel and/or counsel's law firm have objected to a class action settlement within the preceding five years;
- g. whether the objector and/or objector's counsel will appear at the Final Approval Hearing and/or testify at the Final Approval Hearing;

h. a list of all persons who will be called to testify at the Final Approval Hearing in support of the objection (if any);

i. a statement confirming whether the objector and/or objector's counsel utilized any form of artificial intelligence in preparation of the objection; and

j. the objector's signature (an attorney's signature is not sufficient).

76. Class Counsel and/or Defendant's Counsel may conduct limited discovery on any objector or objector's counsel, including taking depositions and document requests. Objections that fail to comply with each and every requirement contained hereinabove will be overruled on procedural grounds without consideration of the merits.

77. Settlement Class Members who object to the Settlement and also file an opt-out request will be deemed to have opted-out of the Settlement.

VII. Claim Process and Disbursement of Settlement Class Member Benefits

78. Claim Forms may be submitted online through the Settlement Website or through U.S. Mail by sending them to the Settlement Administrator at the address designated on the Claim Form.

79. The Settlement Administrator shall collect, review, and address each Claim Form received to determine whether the Claim Form meets the requirements set forth in this Settlement and is thus a Valid Claim. The Settlement Administrator shall examine the Claim Form before designating the Claim as a Valid Claim to determine that the information on the Claim Form is reasonably complete. The Settlement Administrator shall have the sole authority to determine whether a Claim by any Claimant is a Valid Claim.

80. The Settlement Administrator shall use all reasonable efforts and means to identify and reject duplicate claims. No Settlement Class Member may submit more than one Claim Form.

The Settlement Administrator shall identify any Claim Forms that appear to seek relief on behalf of the same Settlement Class Member. If the Settlement Administrator identifies any Claim Form that appears to be a duplication, the Settlement Administrator shall contact the Settlement Class Member in an effort to determine which Claim Form is the appropriate one for consideration.

81. The Settlement Administrator shall exercise, in its discretion, all usual and customary steps to prevent fraud and abuse and take any reasonable steps to prevent fraud and abuse in the Claim process. The Settlement Administrator may, in its discretion, deny in whole or in part any Claim Form to prevent actual or possible fraud or abuse. By agreement, the Parties can instruct the Settlement Administrator to take whatever steps it deems appropriate if the Settlement Administrator identifies actual or possible fraud or abuse relating to the submission of claims, including, but not limited to, denying in whole or in part any Claim to prevent actual or possible fraud or abuse. If any fraud is detected or reasonably suspected, the Settlement Administrator and Parties may require information from Claimants or deny Claims, subject to the supervision of the Parties and ultimate oversight by the Court.

82. Claim Forms that do not meet the terms and conditions of this Settlement shall be promptly rejected by the Settlement Administrator and the Settlement Administrator shall advise the Claimant or Settlement Class member of the reason(s) why the Claim Form was rejected. However, if the Claim Form is rejected for containing incomplete or inaccurate information, and/or omitting required information, the Settlement Administrator may send a Notice of Deficiency explaining what information is missing or inaccurate and needed to validate the Claim and have it submitted for consideration. The Settlement Administrator shall notify the Claimant using the contact information provided in the Claim Form. The additional information and/or documentation can include, for example, answers to questions regarding the validity of the Claimant's physical or

e-signature. A Claimant shall have until the Claim Form Deadline, or 10 days from the date the Notice of Deficiency is sent to the Claimant via mail and postmarked or via email, whichever is later, to reply to the Notice of Deficiency and provide the required information. If the Claimant timely and adequately provides the requested information and/or documentation, the Claim shall be deemed a Valid Claim and processed by the Settlement Administrator. If the Claimant does not timely and completely provide the requested information and/or documentation, the Settlement Administrator shall reduce or deny the Claim unless Defendant and Class Counsel otherwise agree.

83. Where a good faith basis exists, the Settlement Administrator may reduce or reject a Claim for, among other reasons, the following:

- a. Failure to fully complete and/or sign the Claim Form;
- b. Illegible Claim Form;
- c. The Claim Form is fraudulent;
- d. The Claim Form is duplicative of another Claim Form;
- e. The Claimant is not a Settlement Class member;
- f. The Claimant submitted a timely and valid request to opt out of the Settlement Class;
- g. The person submitting the Claim Form requests that payment be made to a person or entity other than the Claimant for whom the Claim Form is submitted;
- h. Failure to submit a Claim Form by the Claim Form Deadline; and/or
- i. The Claim Form otherwise does not comply with the requirements of this Settlement Agreement.

84. The Settlement Administrator's reduction or denial of a Claim is final, subject to the following dispute resolution procedures:

a. The Settlement Administrator shall have 15 days from the Claim Form Deadline to approve or reject Claims.

b. A request for additional information by sending a Notice of Deficiency shall not be considered a denial for purposes of this Paragraph.

c. If a Claim is rejected, the Settlement Administrator shall notify the Claimant using the contact information provided in the Claim Form. Class Counsel and Defendant's Counsel shall be provided with copies of all such notifications to Claimants.

d. The Settlement Administrator's determination as to whether to approve, deny, or reduce a Claim shall be final and binding.

85. The Settlement Administrator shall provide all information gathered in investigating Claims, including, but not limited to, copies of all correspondence and email and all notes of the Settlement Administrator, the decision reached, and all reasons supporting the decision, if requested by Class Counsel or Defendant's Counsel. Additionally, Class Counsel and Defendant's Counsel shall have the right to inspect the Claim Forms and supporting documentation received by the Settlement Administrator at any time upon reasonable notice.

86. No person or entity shall have any claim against Defendant, Defendant's Counsel, Plaintiffs, the Settlement Class, Class Counsel, and/or the Settlement Administrator based on any eligibility determinations, distributions, or awards made in accordance with this Settlement.

87. The Settlement Administrator must submit an invoice to Defendant for payment of all Valid Claims within 10 days of the Claim Form Deadline or as soon as all Claim deficiencies are resolved, whichever occurs later. Defendant shall pay or cause to be paid to the Settlement Administrator the invoiced amount of all Valid Claims within 20 days of the Effective Date.

88. The Settlement Administrator shall distribute Cash Payments no later than 45 days

after the Effective Date. Medical Data Monitoring codes shall be activated 45 days after the Effective Date.

89. Cash Payments to Settlement Class Members will be made by electronic payment. Settlement Class Members will select their form of payment on the Claim Form. In the event of any complications arising in connection with the issuance of an electronic payment, the Settlement Administrator shall provide written notice to Class Counsel and Defendant's Counsel. Absent specific instructions from Class Counsel and Defendant's Counsel, the Settlement Administrator shall proceed to resolve the dispute using its best practices and procedures to ensure that the funds are fairly and properly distributed to the person or persons who are entitled to receive them.

VIII. Final Approval Order and Final Judgment

90. Plaintiffs shall file their Motion for Final Approval of the Settlement, inclusive of the Application for Attorneys' Fees, Costs and Service Awards, no later than 45 days before the initial scheduled Final Approval Hearing. At the Final Approval Hearing, the Court will hear argument on Plaintiffs' Motion for Final Approval of the Settlement and Application for Attorneys' Fees, Costs and Service Awards. In the Court's discretion, the Court will also hear argument at the Final Approval Hearing from any Settlement Class Members (or their counsel) who object to the Settlement and/or to the Application for Attorneys' Fees, Costs and Service Awards provided the objectors submitted timely objections that meet all of the requirements listed in this Agreement.

91. At or following the Final Approval Hearing, the Court will determine whether to enter the Final Approval Order and final judgment thereon, and whether to grant the Application for Attorneys' Fees, Costs and Service Awards. Such proposed Final Approval Order shall, among other things:

- a. Determine that the Settlement is fair, adequate and reasonable;
- b. Finally certify the Settlement Class for settlement purposes only;
- c. Determine that the Notice Program satisfies Due Process requirements;
- d. Bar and enjoin all Releasing Parties from asserting or otherwise pursuing any of the Released Claims at any time and in any jurisdiction, including during any appeal from the Final Approval Order; and retain jurisdiction over the enforcement of the Court's injunctions;
- e. Release Defendant and the other Released Parties from the Released Claims; and
- f. Reserve the Court's continuing and exclusive jurisdiction over the Parties to this Agreement, including Defendant, Plaintiffs, all Settlement Class Members, and all objectors, to administer, supervise, construe, and enforce this Agreement in accordance with its terms.

IX. Attorneys' Fees, Costs and Service Award

92. ***Service Awards*** – As part of the Motion for Final Approval, Class Counsel shall apply to the Court for Service Awards in the amount of \$1,000.00 for each of the Class Representatives. The Service Award payments to Class Representatives shall be separate and apart from their entitlement to a Cash Payment and Medical Data Monitoring. Defendant shall pay or cause to be paid the Court-approved Service Awards to Class Counsel (on the Class Representatives behalf) within 10 days of the Effective Date.

93. ***Attorneys' Fees and Costs*** – As part of the Motion for Final Approval, Class Counsel shall apply to the Court for an award of attorneys' fees and costs of \$400,000.00. Defendant shall pay or cause to be paid the Court-approved attorneys' fees and costs to Class Counsel within 10 days of the Effective Date.

94. This Settlement is not contingent on approval of the request for attorneys' fees, costs, and Service Awards, and if the Court denies the request or grants amounts less than what was requested, the remaining provisions of the Agreement shall remain in force. The provisions for attorneys' fees, costs, and Service Awards were negotiated after all material terms of the Settlement.

X. Releases

95. Upon the Effective Date, and in consideration of the settlement relief and other consideration described herein, the Releasing Parties shall be deemed to have, and by operation of the Final Approval Order shall have, fully, finally, and forever released, acquitted, relinquished, and completely discharged the Released Parties from any and all Released Claims, including but not limited to any state law or common law claims arising out of or relating to the Data Incident that the Releasing Parties may have or had, such as under California's Consumer Privacy Act, California Civil Code section 1798.100, *et seq.* and/or California's Unfair Competition Law, California Civil Code section 17200 *et seq.* Each Party expressly waives all rights under California Civil Code section 1542, which provides:

A GENERAL RELEASE DOES NOT EXTEND TO CLAIMS THAT THE CREDITOR OR RELEASING PARTY DOES NOT KNOW OR SUSPECT TO EXIST IN HIS OR HER FAVOR AT THE TIME OF EXECUTING THE RELEASE AND THAT, IF KNOWN BY HIM OR HER, WOULD HAVE MATERIALLY AFFECTED HIS OR HER SETTLEMENT WITH THE DEBTOR OR RELEASED PARTY.

96. The Releasing Parties agree that, once this Agreement is executed, they will not, directly or indirectly, individually or in concert with another, maintain, cause to be maintained, or voluntarily assist in maintaining any further demand, action, claim, lawsuit, arbitration, or similar proceeding, in any capacity whatsoever, against any of the Released Parties based on any of the Released Claims.

97. Settlement Class members who opt out of the Settlement prior to the Opt-Out Deadline do not release their claims.

98. Upon the Effective Date: (a) this Settlement shall be the exclusive remedy for any and all Released Claims of Plaintiffs and Settlement Class Members; and (b) Plaintiffs and Settlement Class Members stipulate to be and shall be permanently barred and enjoined by Court order from initiating, asserting, or prosecuting any Released Claim against the Released Parties, whether on behalf of Plaintiffs, any Settlement Class Member or others, in any jurisdiction, including in any federal, state, or local court or tribunal.

XI. Termination of Settlement

99. This Agreement shall be subject to and is expressly conditioned on the occurrence of all of the following events:

- a. Court approval of the Settlement Class Member Benefits and the Release in this Agreement;
- b. The Court has entered the Preliminary Approval Order;
- c. The Court has entered the Final Approval Order, and all objections, if any, are overruled, and all appeals taken from the Final Approval Order are resolved in favor of Final Approval; and
- d. The Effective Date has occurred.

100. If any of the conditions specified in the preceding paragraph are not met, or if the Court otherwise imposes any modification or condition to approval of the Settlement to which the Parties do not consent, then this Agreement shall be cancelled and terminated.

101. Furthermore, if more than 250 Settlement Class Members opt out of the Settlement, the Defendant shall have the right to terminate the Agreement. Defendant must notify Class

Counsel of its intention to terminate the Agreement within 10 days of the Opt-Out Deadline. Defendant shall also have the right to terminate the Agreement if more than 100 Valid Claims for Cash Payments for Documented Losses are received and the total amount claimed for such Valid Claims equals or exceeds \$500,000.00. Defendant must notify Class Counsel of its intention to terminate the Agreement on this basis within 10 days after receiving the Settlement Administrator's report identifying the number and total amount of such Valid Claims.

XII. Effect of Termination

102. The grounds upon which this Agreement may be terminated are set forth in Section XI. In the event this Agreement is terminated or fails to become effective for any reason, this Agreement shall be deemed null and void and shall have no further force or effect; all obligations of Plaintiffs, Class Counsel, Defendant, and Defendant's Counsel under the Settlement shall cease; and the Parties shall be restored to the *status quo ante* in the Action as if they had not entered into this Agreement. In such event, the Parties shall jointly file a status report with the Court seeking to reopen the Action, all Parties' respective pre-Settlement rights, claims, and defenses shall be retained and preserved, the terms and provisions of this Agreement shall not be used in this Action or in any other action or proceeding for any purpose, and any order entered by the Court in accordance with the terms of this Agreement shall be treated as vacated, *nunc pro tunc*.

103. In the event the Settlement is terminated in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement, any discussions, offers, or negotiations associated with this Settlement shall not be discoverable or offered into evidence or used in the Action or any other action or proceeding for any purpose. In such event, all Parties to the Action shall stand in the same position as if this Agreement had not been negotiated, made, or filed with the Court.

XIII. No Admission of Liability

104. This Agreement reflects the Parties' compromise and settlement of disputed claims. This Agreement shall not be construed as or deemed to be evidence of an admission or concession of any point of fact or law. Defendant has denied and continues to deny each of the claims and contentions alleged in the Complaint. Defendant specifically denies that a class could or should be certified in the Action for litigation purposes. Defendant does not admit any liability or wrongdoing of any kind, by this Agreement or otherwise. Defendant has agreed to enter into this Agreement to avoid the further expense, inconvenience, and distraction of burdensome and protracted litigation, and to be completely free of any further claims that were asserted or could possibly have been asserted in the Action.

105. Class Counsel believe the claims asserted in the Action have merit, and they have examined and considered the benefits to be obtained under the proposed Settlement set forth in this Agreement, the risks associated with the continued prosecution of this complex, costly, and time-consuming litigation, and the likelihood of success on the merits of the Action. Class Counsel have investigated the facts and law relevant to the merits of the claims, conducted informal discovery, and conducted independent investigation of the alleged claims. Class Counsel concluded that the proposed Settlement set forth in this Agreement is fair, adequate, reasonable, and in the best interests of the Settlement Class members.

106. This Agreement constitutes a compromise and settlement of disputed claims. No action taken by the Parties in connection with the negotiations of this Agreement shall be deemed or construed to be an admission of the truth or falsity of any claims or defenses heretofore made, or an acknowledgment or admission by any party of any fault, liability, or wrongdoing of any kind whatsoever.

107. Neither the Settlement, nor any act performed or document executed pursuant to or

in furtherance of the Settlement, (a) is or may be deemed to be, or may be used as, an admission of, or evidence of, the validity of any claim made by the Plaintiffs or Settlement Class Members, or of any wrongdoing or liability of the Released Parties; or (b) is or may be deemed to be, or may be used as, an admission of, or evidence of, any fault or omission of any of the Released Parties, in the Action or in any proceeding in any court, administrative agency, or other tribunal.

108. In addition to any other defenses Defendant or the Released Parties may have at law, in equity, or otherwise, to the extent permitted by law, this Agreement may be pleaded as a full and complete defense to and may be used as the basis for an injunction against, any action, suit, or other proceeding that may be instituted, prosecuted, or attempted in breach of this Agreement or the Releases contained herein.

XIV. Miscellaneous Provisions

109. *Confidentiality.* To the extent permitted by ethics rules, the Parties and their counsel shall keep confidential all settlement communications, including communications regarding the negotiation and drafting of this Agreement. The Parties will not make any public statement about the settlement that has not been approved by the other side, except as required or authorized by law. Approval of any proposed public statement of the other side will not be unreasonably withheld. The Parties will cooperate with each other regarding public statements about the settlement and may issue a joint statement/press release if they mutually agree to do so. This paragraph shall not be construed to limit or impede the Notice requirements contained in this Agreement, nor shall this paragraph be construed to prevent Class Counsel or Defendant's Counsel from notifying or explaining that the Action has settled or limit the representations that the Parties or their counsel may make to the Court to assist in the Court's evaluation of the Settlement, Preliminary Approval, Final Approval, and any objection to the Settlement's terms. Defendant

may also provide information about the Settlement to its attorneys, members, partners, insurers, brokers, agents, and other persons or entities as required by securities laws or other applicable laws and regulations.

110. ***Gender and Plurals.*** As used in this Agreement, the masculine, feminine or neuter gender, and the singular or plural number, shall each be deemed to include the others whenever the context so indicates.

111. ***Binding Effect.*** This Agreement shall be binding upon, and inure to and for the benefit of, the successors and assigns of the Releasing Parties and the Released Parties.

112. ***Cooperation of Parties.*** The Parties to this Agreement agree to cooperate in good faith to prepare and execute all documents, seek Court approval, uphold Court approval, and do all things reasonably necessary to complete and effectuate the Settlement described in this Agreement.

113. ***Obligation to Meet and Confer.*** Before filing any motion in the Court raising a dispute arising out of or related to this Agreement, the Parties shall consult with each other and certify to the Court that they have met and conferred in an attempt to resolve the dispute.

114. ***Integration and No Reliance.*** This Agreement constitutes a single, integrated written contract expressing the entire agreement of the Parties relative to the subject matter hereof. This Agreement is executed without reliance on any covenant, agreement, representation, or warranty by any Party or any Party's representative other than those expressly set forth in this Agreement. No covenants, agreements, representations, or warranties of any kind whatsoever have been made by any Party hereto, except as provided for herein.

115. ***No Conflict Intended.*** Any inconsistency between the headings used in this Agreement and the text of the paragraphs of this Agreement shall be resolved in favor of the text.

116. ***Governing Law.*** Except as otherwise provided herein, the Agreement shall be construed in accordance with, and be governed by, the laws of the state of Florida, without regard to the principles thereof regarding choice of law.

117. ***Counterparts.*** This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument, even though all Parties do not sign the same counterparts. Original signatures are not required. Any signature submitted by facsimile or through email of a PDF shall be deemed an original.

118. ***Jurisdiction.*** The Court shall retain jurisdiction over the implementation, enforcement, and performance of this Agreement, and shall have exclusive jurisdiction over any suit, action, proceeding, or dispute arising out of or relating to this Agreement that cannot be resolved by negotiation and agreement by counsel for the Parties. The Court shall also retain jurisdiction over all questions and/or disputes related to the Notice Program and the Settlement Administrator. As part of the agreement to render services in connection with this Settlement, the Settlement Administrator shall consent to the jurisdiction of the Court for this purpose. The Court shall retain jurisdiction over the enforcement of the Court's injunction barring and enjoining all Releasing Parties from asserting any of the Released Claims and from pursuing any Released Claims against the Released Parties at any time and in any jurisdiction, including during any appeal from the Final Approval Order.

119. ***Notices.*** All notices provided for herein shall be sent by email with a hard copy sent by overnight mail to:

120. ***Modification and Amendment.*** This Agreement may not be amended or modified, except by a written instrument signed by Class Counsel and Defendant's Counsel and, if the Settlement has been approved preliminarily by the Court, approved by the Court.

121. ***No Waiver.*** The waiver by any Party of any breach of this Agreement by another Party shall not be deemed or construed as a waiver of any other breach, whether prior, subsequent,

or contemporaneous, of this Agreement.

122. ***Authority.*** Class Counsel (for Plaintiffs and the Settlement Class Members), and Defendant's Counsel, represent and warrant that the persons signing this Agreement on their behalf have full power and authority to bind every person, partnership, corporation, or entity included within the definitions of Plaintiffs and Defendant respectively to all terms of this Agreement. Any person executing this Agreement in a representative capacity represents and warrants that he or she is fully authorized to do so and to bind the Party on whose behalf he or she signs this Agreement to all of the terms and provisions of this Agreement.

123. ***Agreement Mutually Prepared.*** Neither Plaintiffs nor Defendant shall be considered to be the drafter of this Agreement or any of its provisions for the purpose of any statute, case law, or rule of interpretation or construction that would or might cause any provision to be construed against the drafter of this Agreement.

124. ***Independent Investigation and Decision to Settle.*** The Parties understand and acknowledge they: (a) have performed an independent investigation of the allegations of fact and law made in connection with this Action; and (b) that even if they may hereafter discover facts in addition to, or different from, those that they now know or believe to be true with respect to the subject matter of the Action as reflected in this Agreement, that will not affect or in any respect limit the binding nature of this Agreement. All Parties recognize and acknowledge they reviewed and analyzed data that they and their experts used to make certain determinations, arguments, and settlement positions. The Parties agree this Settlement is fair, reasonable, and adequate, and will not attempt to renegotiate or otherwise void or invalidate or terminate the Settlement irrespective of what any unexamined data later shows. It is the Parties' intention to resolve their disputes in connection with this Action pursuant to the terms of this Agreement now and thus, in furtherance

of their intentions, the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect notwithstanding the discovery of any additional facts or law, or changes in law, and this Agreement shall not be subject to rescission or modification by reason of any changes or differences in facts or law, subsequently occurring or otherwise.

125. ***Receipt of Advice of Counsel.*** Each Party acknowledges, agrees, and specifically warrants that he, she, or it has fully read this Agreement and the Releases contained herein, received independent legal advice with respect to the advisability of entering into this Agreement and the Releases, and the legal effects of this Agreement and the Releases, and fully understands the effect of this Agreement and the Releases.

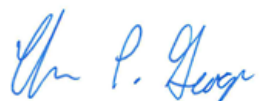

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Basic Information

1. Why was this Notice issued?

The Circuit Court for Broward County, Florida, authorized this Notice. You have a right to know about the proposed Settlement of this class action lawsuit, and about all of your options, before the Court decides whether to grant final approval of the Settlement. This Notice explains the lawsuit, your legal rights, what benefits are available, and who can receive them.

The lawsuit is called *Brett Conner v. CPAP Medical Supplies and Services, Inc.*, Case No. [CASE NUMBER]. It is pending in the Circuit Court for Broward County, Florida. The people that filed this lawsuit are called the “Plaintiffs” (or “Class Representatives”) and the company they sued, CPAP Medical Supplies and Services, Inc., is called the “Defendant.”

2. What is this lawsuit about?

This lawsuit alleges that during the December 2024 targeted cyberattack on CPAP's computer systems, certain files that contained private information were accessed. These files may have contained personal information such as names; physical addresses; email addresses; telephone numbers; Social Security numbers; drivers’ license numbers; health insurance information; medical histories; treatment plans; and financial information.

3. What is a class action?

In a class action, one or more individuals sue on behalf of other people with similar claims. These individuals are called the “Plaintiffs” or “Class Representatives.” Together, the people included in the class action are called a “Class” or “Class Members.” One court resolves the lawsuit for all Class Members, except for those who opt out from the settlement. In this Settlement, the Class Representatives are Brett Conner; Juwan Overshown; Diane Edwards; Stephen Follett; Roderic Woods; John Crist; Chris Harrima; and Tyrone Woods. Everyone included in this Action are the Class Members.

4. Why is there a Settlement?

The Court did not decide whether the Plaintiffs or the Defendant are right. Both sides have agreed to a Settlement to avoid the costs and risks of a trial, and to allow the Class Members to receive benefits from the Settlement. The Plaintiffs and their attorneys think the Settlement is best for all Class Members.

Who is in the Settlement?

5. Who is included in the Settlement?

The court has defined the Class this way: “All living individuals residing in the United States who were sent notice by Defendant that their Private Information may have been impacted in the Data Incident.”

6. Are there exceptions to being included?

Yes. Excluded from the Class are: (a) all persons who are directors, officers, and agents of Defendant; (b) governmental entities; (c) the Judge assigned to the Action, that Judge’s immediate family, and Court staff; and (d) any Settlement Class Member who timely and properly opt-outs of the Settlement.

The Settlement Benefits

7. What does the Settlement provide?

CPAP has agreed to pay for two Class benefits, which are explained below. All Class Members may claim two years of **Medical Data Monitoring** from CyEx Medical Shield Complete, and a **Cash Payment for Documented Losses**.

MEDICAL DATA MONITORING. All Class Members are eligible to claim two years of CyEx Medical Shield Complete. This comprehensive service comes with \$1 million of medical identity theft insurance, and includes monitoring for:

- healthcare insurance ID exposure
- Medical Record Number (MRN) exposure
- unauthorized Health Savings Account (HSA) spending

If anything suspicious happens, you will be able to talk to a fraud resolution agent to help fix any problems.

CASH PAYMENT FOR DOCUMENTED LOSSES. If you incurred actual, documented out-of-pocket losses due to the Data Incident, you can get back up to **\$5,000.00**. The losses must have occurred between December 13, 2024, and [Claims Deadline]. There will be a maximum of \$500,000.00 payable by the Defendant for this benefit. In the event the total dollar amount of all Valid Claims for this benefit exceed that amount, Settlement Class Members' distribution amounts will be reduced *pro rata*.

This benefit covers out-of-pocket expenses like:

- losses because of identity theft or fraud
- fees for credit reports, credit monitoring, or freezing and unfreezing your credit
- cost to replace your IDs
- postage to contact banks by mail

You need to send proof, like bank statements or receipts, to show how much you spent or lost. You can also send notes or papers you made yourself to explain or support other proof, but those notes or papers alone are not enough to make a valid claim. Your proof or notes should show that your expenses were because of the Data Incident.

You cannot claim a payment for expenses that have already been reimbursed by a third party.

8. What claims am I releasing if I stay in the Settlement Class?

If you stay in the Settlement Class, you won't be able to be part of any other lawsuit against CPAP about the issues that this Settlement covers because you will release all of your claims against CPAP related to the Data Incident. The "Releases" section of the Settlement Agreement (Section X) describes the legal claims that you give up if you remain in the Class. The Released Claims will include any and all actual, potential, filed or unfiled, known or unknown, fixed or contingent, claimed or unclaimed, suspected or unsuspected claims, demands, liabilities, rights, causes of action, damages, punitive, exemplary or multiplied damages, expenses, costs, indemnities, attorneys' fees and/or obligations, whether in law or in equity, accrued or unaccrued, direct, individual or representative, of every nature and description whatsoever, based on any federal, state, local, statutory or common law or any other law, against the Released Parties, or any of them, arising out of or relating to actual or alleged facts, transactions, events, matters, occurrences, acts, disclosures, statements, representations, omissions or failures to act relating to the Data Incident. The Released Parties includes Defendant and each and every one of its past, present, affiliates, divisions, employees, servants, members, providers, partners, principals, directors, officers, and owners, and all of their respective attorneys, heirs, executors, administrators, insurers, coinsurers, reinsurers, joint ventures, personal representatives, predecessors, successors, transferees, trustees, authorized agents, and assigns, and includes, without limitation, any person related to any such entities who is, was, or could have been named as a defendant in the Action.

10. Are there any important Settlement payment deadlines?

If you are submitting a Claim Form online, you must do so by [Claims Deadline]. If you are submitting a claim by U.S. mail, the completed and signed Claim Form, including supporting documentation, must be postmarked no later than [Claims Deadline].

11. When will the Settlement benefits be issued?

The Court will hold a final approval hearing on [FA Hearing Date] (see Question 18). If the Court approves the Settlement, there may be appeals. We do not know if appeals will be filed, or how long it will take to resolve them if they are filed.

Settlement payments will be distributed if the Court grants final approval, and after any appeals are resolved.

The Lawyers Representing You

12. Do I have a lawyer in the case?

Yes, the Court has appointed attorneys Jeff Ostrow of Kopelowitz Ostrow P.A. and Mariya Weekes of Milberg PLLC, to represent you and other Class Members ("Class Counsel").

13. Should I get my own lawyer?

You will not be charged for Class Counsel's services. If you want your own lawyer, you may hire one at your expense.

14. How will Class Counsel be paid?

Class Counsel will ask the court to approve \$400,000.00 as reasonable attorneys' fees and reimbursement of litigation costs. This amount will be paid by CPAP.

Class Counsel will also ask for Service Award payments of \$1,000.00 for each of the Class Representatives. Service Award payments will also be paid by CPAP.

Excluding Yourself from the Settlement

15. How do I opt out of the Settlement?

If you do not want to be part of the Settlement, you must formally exclude yourself from the Settlement. This is called a Request for Exclusion, and is sometimes also called “opting out.” If you opt out, you will not receive Settlement benefits or payment. However, you will keep any rights you may have to sue CPAP on your own about the legal issues in this case.

If you exclude yourself, you are telling the Court that you do not want to be part of the Settlement. You will not be eligible to receive any Settlement benefits if you exclude yourself.

The deadline to exclude yourself from the Settlement is **[Opt-Out Deadline]**.

To be valid, your Request for Exclusion must have the following information:

- (1) the name of the Litigation: *Brett Conner v. CPAP Medical Supplies and Services, Inc.*, Case No. **[CASE NUMBER]**, pending in the Circuit Court for Broward County, Florida;

Commenting on or Objecting to the Settlement

16. How do I tell the Court if I like or do not like the Settlement?

If you are a Class Member and do not like part or all of the Settlement, you can object to it. Objecting means telling the Court your reasons for why you think the Court should not approve the Settlement. The Court will consider your views.

You cannot object if you have excluded yourself from the Settlement (**see Question 15**)

You must provide the following information for the Court to consider your objection:

- a. The case name and case number;
- b. the objector’s full name, mailing address, telephone number, and email address (if any);

- c. all grounds for the objection, accompanied by any legal support for the objection known to the objector or objector's counsel;
- d. the number of times the objector has objected to a class action settlement within the five years preceding the date that the objector files the objection, the caption of each case in which the objector has made such objection, and a copy of any orders related to or ruling upon the objector's prior objections that were issued by the trial and appellate courts in each listed case;
- e. the identity of all counsel who represent the objector, including any former or current counsel who may be entitled to compensation for any reason related to the objection to the Settlement and/or Application for Attorneys' Fees, Costs, and Service Awards;
- f. the number of times in which the objector's counsel and/or counsel's law firm have objected to a class action settlement within the five years preceding the date of the filed objection, the caption of each case in which counsel or the firm has made such objection and a copy of any orders related to or ruling upon counsel's or the counsel's law firm's prior objections that were issued by the trial and appellate courts in each listed case in which the objector's counsel and/or counsel's law firm have objected to a class action settlement within the preceding five years;
- g. whether the objector and/or objector's counsel will appear at the Final Approval Hearing and/or testify at the Final Approval Hearing;
- h. a list of all persons who will be called to testify at the Final Approval Hearing in support of the objection (if any);
- i. a statement confirming whether the objector and/or objector's counsel utilized any form of artificial intelligence in preparation of the objection; and
- j. the objector's signature (an attorney's signature is not sufficient).

For your objection to be valid, it must meet each of these requirements.

To be considered by the Court, you must file your complete objection with the Clerk of Court by **OBJECTION DEADLINE**. You must also send a copy of the objection to the Settlement Administrator, Class Counsel, and counsel for Defendants.

17. What is the difference between objecting and excluding?

Objecting is telling the Court that you do not like something about the Settlement. You can object to the Settlement only if you do not exclude yourself from the Settlement. Excluding yourself from the Settlement is opting out and stating to the Court that you do not want to be part of the Settlement. If you opt out of the Settlement, you cannot object to it because the Settlement no longer affects you.

The Court's Final Approval Hearing

18. When is the Court's Final Approval Hearing?

The Court will hold a final approval on **[FA Hearing Date]** at **[Hearing Time]** Eastern Time, in Room **[Court Room]** of the Circuit Court for Broward County, Florida, at **[Court Address]**.

At the final approval hearing, the Court will decide whether to approve the Settlement. The court will also decide how Class Counsel should be paid, and whether to award Service Award payments to the Class Representatives. The Court will also consider any objections to the Settlement.

If you are a Class Member, you or your lawyer may ask permission to speak at the hearing at your own cost (**See Question 16**).

The date and time of this hearing may change without further notice. Please check **www.[SettlementWebsite].com** for updates.

19. Do I have to come to the Final Approval Hearing?

No. Class Counsel will answer any questions the Court may have. You may attend at your own expense if you wish, but you do not have to.

If you file an objection, you do not have to come to the Final Approval Hearing to talk about it; the Court will consider it as long as it was filed on time. You may also pay your own lawyer to attend, but you do not have to.

If I Do Nothing

20. What happens if I do nothing at all?

If you do nothing, you will not receive a benefit from this Settlement.

You will also give up the rights described in **Question 8**.

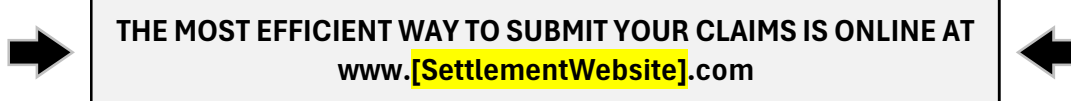

**[PROPOSED] ORDER GRANTING PLAINTIFFS' UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR
PRELIMINARY APPROVAL OF CLASS ACTION SETTLEMENT**

WHEREAS, this Action is a putative class action before the Court;

WHEREAS, Plaintiffs, individually, and on behalf of the Settlement Class, and Defendant have agreed, subject to Court approval under the Florida Rules of Civil Procedure, to settle this Action upon the terms and conditions stated in the Agreement, which, among other things and together with its exhibits, provides for a complete dismissal on the merits and with prejudice of the claims asserted in the Action against Defendant should the Court grant Final Approval of the Settlement;

WHEREAS, Plaintiffs filed an unopposed motion requesting entry of an order to: (1) conditionally certify the Settlement Class; (2) appoint Plaintiffs as Class Representatives; (3) appoint counsel listed in the Agreement as Class Counsel; (4) preliminarily approve the Settlement; (5) approve the Notice Program and Notices and direct that Notice be sent to the Settlement Class Members; (6) approve the Claim Form and Claims Process; (7) order the Settlement's opt-out and

objection procedures; (8) appoint the Settlement Administrator; (9) stay all deadlines in the Action pending Final Approval of the Settlement; (10) enjoin and bar all members of the Settlement Class from initiating or continuing in any litigation or asserting any claims against Defendants and the Released Parties arising out of, relating to, or in connection with the Released Claims prior to the Court's decision to grant Final Approval of the Settlement; and (11) set a date for the Final Approval Hearing;

NOW, THEREFORE, based on the Agreement, all the files, records, and proceedings herein, statements of counsel, and it appearing to the Court that a Final Approval Hearing should be held to determine whether the proposed settlement described in the Agreement should be finally approved as fair, reasonable, and adequate.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

1. All capitalized terms herein shall have the same meanings as those defined in Section II of the Settlement Agreement.
2. This Court has personal jurisdiction over the subject matter of this Action and the Parties, including Plaintiffs and all Settlement Class Members.
3. The Court preliminarily approves of the Settlement, including the Notice Program, finding that the proposed Settlement is sufficiently fair, reasonable, and adequate to warrant providing Notice to the Settlement Class, but such finding is not to be deemed as an admission of fault or liability by Defendant or a finding of the validity of any claims asserted in the Action or of any wrongdoing or of any violation of law by Defendant. Defendant shall maintain all rights to assert that, but for settlement purposes, the Action should be certified as a class.
4. For purposes of determining whether the terms of the Settlement should be finally approved as fair, reasonable, and adequate, the following Settlement Class is preliminarily certified

for settlement purposes only:

All living individuals residing in the United States who were sent notice by the Defendant that their Private Information may have been impacted in the Data Incident.

5. Excluded from the Settlement Class are (a) all persons who are directors, officers, and agents of Defendant; (b) governmental entities; (c) the Judge assigned to the Action, that Judge's immediate family, and Court staff; and (d) any Settlement Class Member who timely and Properly opts-out of the Settlement.

6. The Court preliminarily finds the terms of the Settlement are fair, adequate, and reasonable. In so finding, the Court has considered several factors, including: (1) the complexity and duration of the litigation; (2) the reaction of the class to the settlement; (3) the stage of the proceedings; (4) the risk of establishing liability; (5) the risk of establishing damages; (6) the risk of maintaining a class action; (7) the ability of the defendant to withstand a greater judgment; (8) the reasonableness of the settlement in light of the best recovery; and (9) the range of reasonableness of the settlement in light of all the attendant risks of litigation.

7. The Court finds that, for purposes of settlement: the number of members of the Settlement Class is so numerous that joinder is impracticable; there are questions of law and fact common to the members of the Settlement Class; the claims of the Plaintiffs are typical of the claims of the members of the Settlement Class; the Plaintiffs are adequate representatives for the Settlement Class, and have retained experienced and adequate Class Counsel; the questions of law and fact common to the members of the Settlement Class predominate over any questions affecting any individual members of the Settlement Class; and a class action is superior to the other available methods for the fair and efficient adjudication of the controversy.

8. For purposes of settlement only, the Court finds and determines that Plaintiffs will

fairly and adequately represent the interests of the Settlement Class in enforcing their rights in the Action, and appoints them as Class Representatives, and the following attorneys are preliminarily appointed as Class Counsel for the Settlement Class: Jeff Ostrow of Kopelowitz Ostrow P.A. and Mariya Weekes of Milberg PLLC.

9. The Parties have selected Simpluris, Inc. to serve as the Settlement Administrator. The Court hereby approves of and appoints Simpluris and directs it to commence the Notice Program and initiate the Claims Process and to otherwise comply with all obligations of the Settlement Administrator as outlined in the Agreement.

10. The Parties have prepared the Notices, which are attached to the Agreement. The Court preliminarily finds that the Notice provided to Settlement Class members is the most practicable notice; is reasonably calculated, under the circumstances, to apprise Settlement Class Members of the pendency of the Action and of their right to object or to exclude themselves from the Settlement; and is reasonable and constitutes due, adequate, and sufficient notice to all Settlement Class Members entitled to receive notice.

11. The Court has carefully reviewed and hereby approves the Notices as to form and content and directs that they be without material alteration unless otherwise modified by agreement of the Parties and approved by the Court. The Court directs that the Notice Program be implemented as outlined in the Agreement.

12. Settlement Class Members who wish to opt-out of the Settlement and exclude themselves from participation may do so by submitting timely and proper equests at any time before the Opt-Out Deadline (30 days before the initial scheduled Final Approval Hearing). The process to opt-out is set forth in the Agreement and in the Notices. Settlement Class members who opt-out shall have no rights under the Settlement, shall not share in any Settlement Class Member

Benefits, and shall not be bound by the Settlement or by the Final Approval Order. “Mass” or “class” requests for exclusion filed by third parties on behalf of a “mass” or “class” of Settlement Class Members or multiple Settlement Class Members where the opt-out has not been signed by each and every individual Settlement Class Member will not be allowed.

13. All Settlement Class Members who do not submit a timely, written request for exclusion in the manner set forth in the Notice and Agreement shall be bound by any Final Approval Order and final judgment entered, even if such Settlement Class Members never received actual notice of this Action or the Settlement. If Final Approval of the Settlement is granted, they shall be barred, now and in the future, from asserting any of the Released Claims, as defined in the Agreement, against any Released Parties as defined in the Agreement.

14. Settlement Class Members who wish to object to the Settlement and/or to Class Counsel’s Application for Attorneys’ Fees, Costs, and Service Awards shall file any objections pursuant to the requirements of this paragraph. The Objection Deadline is 30 days before the initial scheduled Final Approval Hearing. To be considered, the objection must include: (a) the name of the case and case number, the objector’s full name, mailing address, telephone number, and email address (if any); (b) all grounds for the objection, accompanied by any legal support for the objection known to the objector or objector’s counsel; (c) the number of times the objector has objected to a class action settlement within the five years preceding the date that the objector files the objection, the caption of each case in which the objector has made such objection, and a copy of any orders related to or ruling upon the objector’s prior objections that were issued by the trial and appellate courts in each listed case; (d) the identity of all counsel who represent the objector, including any former or current counsel who may be entitled to compensation for any reason related to the objection to the Settlement and/or Application for Attorneys’ Fees, Costs, and Service

Awards; (e) the number of times in which the objector's counsel and/or counsel's law firm have objected to a class action settlement within the five years preceding the date of the filed objection, the caption of each case in which counsel or the firm has made such objection and a copy of any orders related to or ruling upon counsel's or the counsel's law firm's prior objections that were issued by the trial and appellate courts in each listed case in which the objector's counsel and/or counsel's law firm have objected to a class action settlement within the preceding five years; (f) whether the objector and/or objector's counsel will appear at the Final Approval Hearing and/or testify at the Final Approval Hearing; (g) a list of all persons who will be called to testify at the Final Approval Hearing in support of the objection (if any); (h) a statement confirming whether the objector and/or objector's counsel utilized any form of artificial intelligence in preparation for the objection; and (i) the objector's signature (an attorney's signature is not sufficient). Class Counsel and/or Defendant's Counsel may conduct limited discovery on any objector or objector's counsel, including taking depositions and propounding written document requests.

15. Objections to the Settlement and/or the Application for Attorneys' Fees, Costs, and Service Awards must be filed with the Court, and sent by U.S. Mail to Class Counsel, Defendant's Counsel, and the Settlement Administrator. For an objection to be considered by the Court, the objection must be submitted no later than the Objection Deadline (30 days before the initial scheduled Final Approval Hearing), as specified in the Notices. If submitted by mail, an objection shall be deemed to have been submitted on the date the mail is postmarked. If submitted by courier, an objection shall be deemed to have been submitted on the shipping date reflected on the shipping label. Any Settlement Class Member who does not make an objection in the manner provided herein shall be deemed to have waived the right to object to any aspect of the Settlement and/or to the Application for Attorneys' Fees and Costs and, if Final Judgment is entered, shall forever be

barred and foreclosed from raising such objections in this or any other proceeding and from challenging or opposing, or seeking to reverse, vacate, or modify, the Final Judgment or any aspect thereof. Failure to comply with each and every objection requirement set forth in paragraph 15 above will result in the objection being overruled on procedural grounds without consideration of its merits..

16. In advance of the Final Approval Hearing, the Settlement Administrator shall prepare a declaration for the Parties confirming that the Notice Program was completed in accordance with the terms of the Agreement and this Preliminary Approval Order, describing how the Notice Program was completed, indicating the number of Claim Forms received, providing the names of each Settlement Class Member who timely and properly requested to opt out from the Settlement Class, indicating the number of objections received, and other information as may be necessary to allow the Parties to seek and obtain Final Approval.

17. The Court will hold a Final Approval Hearing to consider the fairness, reasonableness, and adequacy of the Settlement. The Court will advise the Parties in advance of the Final Approval Hearing whether the hearing will be held in person at the Broward County Courthouse or virtually by Zoom or another video platform. The date and time of the Final Approval Hearing will be set forth in the Notice and published on the Settlement Website. During the Final Approval Hearing, the Court will consider whether the Settlement should be approved as fair, reasonable, and adequate, and whether the Court should enter the proposed Final Approval Order and final judgment approving the Settlement and dismissing this Action on the merits, with prejudice. The Court will also consider the amount of any attorneys' fees and costs to be awarded to Class Counsel and whether to approve the amount of any Service Award to the Class Representatives. The Final Approval Hearing may be postponed, adjourned, or rescheduled by

order of the Court without further notice to Settlement Class Members other than on the Settlement Website and the Court's docket.

18. The Court confirms the following schedule (which the court, upon showing of good cause by the Parties, may extend any of the deadlines):

Deadline to commence Notice Program	Within 30 days of Preliminary Approval
Deadline to complete Notice Program	No later than 45 days before the initial scheduled Final Approval Hearing
Deadline for filing Motion for Final Approval and Class Counsel's Application for Attorneys' Fees, Costs, and Service Awards	No later than 45 days before the initial scheduled Final Approval Hearing
Opt-Out Deadline	30 days before the initial scheduled Final Approval Hearing
Objection Deadline	30 days before the initial scheduled Final Approval Hearing
Claim Form Deadline	90 days from Notice Commencement
Final Approval Hearing	To be noticed by Class Counsel by separate notice of hearing on a date no less than 120 days following Preliminary Approval.

19. If the Settlement is terminated, not approved, canceled, fails to become effective for any reason, or the Effective Date does not occur, this order shall become null and void and shall be without prejudice to the rights of Plaintiffs, the Settlement Class Members, and Defendant, all of whom shall be restored to their respective positions in the Action as provided in the Agreement

20. The Court stays all proceedings in this Action until further Order of the Court, except that the Parties may conduct such limited proceedings as may be necessary to implement the Settlement or to effectuate the term of the Agreement. Upon the entry of this order, with the exception of Class Counsel, Defendant's Counsel, Defendant, and the Class Representatives implementation of the Settlement and the approval process in this Action, all members of the

Settlement Class shall be provisionally enjoined and barred from asserting any claims or continuing any litigation against the Defendant and the Released Parties arising out of, relating to, or in connection with the Released Claims prior to the Court's decision as to whether to grant Final Approval of the Settlement. For the benefit of the Settlement Class and to protect this Court's jurisdiction, this Court retains continuing jurisdiction over the Settlement proceedings to ensure the effectuation thereof in accordance with the Settlement preliminarily approved herein and the related orders of this Court.

WHEREAS, thereafter, Email Notice and Postcard Notice was provided to the Settlement Class in accordance with the Court's Preliminary Approval Order and the Long Form Notice was available to Settlement Class Members on the Settlement Website or upon request to the Settlement Administrator;

WHEREAS, there were no objections to the Settlement and _____ Settlement Class Members opted-out of the Settlement;

WHEREAS, on _____, 2026, the Court held a Final Approval Hearing to determine whether the Settlement was fair, reasonable, and adequate, and to consider Class Counsel's Application for Attorneys' Fees, Costs, and Service Awards;

WHEREAS, based on the foregoing, having considered the papers filed and proceedings held in connection with the Settlement, having considered all of the other files, records, and proceedings in the Action, and being otherwise fully advised;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AND ADJUDGED as follows:

1. This Final Approval Order incorporates the definitions in Section II of the Settlement Agreement.

2. The Notice provided to the Settlement Class in accordance with the Preliminary Approval Order was the best notice practicable under the circumstances and constituted due and sufficient notice of the proceedings and matters set forth therein to all persons entitled to notice. The Notice and Notice Program fully satisfied the requirements of due process, Florida Rule of Civil Procedure 1.220, and all other applicable law and rules. The Claims Process was fair, and the Claim Form was easy to read and understand.

3. The terms of the Settlement are fair, adequate, and reasonable. In so finding, the Court has considered several factors, including: (1) the complexity and duration of the litigation;

(2) the reaction of the class to the Settlement; (3) the stage of the proceedings; (4) the risk of establishing liability; (5) the risk of establishing damages; (6) the risk of maintaining a class action; (7) the ability of the Defendant to withstand a greater judgment; (8) the reasonableness of the settlement in light of the best recovery; and (9) the range of reasonableness of the settlement in light of all the attendant risks of litigation.

4. Based on the information presented to the Court, the Claims Process has proceeded as ordered and consistent with the Agreement and Preliminary Approval Order. All Settlement Class Members who submitted Valid Claims shall receive their Settlement Class Member Benefits pursuant to the Settlement's terms. All Settlement Class Members who did not submit a Claim, or for whom the Claim is determined to be invalid, shall still be bound by the terms of the Settlement and Releases therein.

5. The distribution plan for Settlement Class Member Benefits proposed by the Parties in the Agreement is fair, reasonable, and adequate.

6. The Class Representatives and Class Counsel have fairly and adequately represented and will continue to adequately represent and protect the interests of Settlement Class Members in connection with the Settlement.

7. Because the Court grants Final Approval of the Settlement set forth in the Agreement as fair, reasonable, and adequate, the Court authorizes and directs implementation of all terms and provisions of the Settlement.

8. All Parties to this Action, including all Settlement Class Members, are bound by the Settlement as set forth in the Agreement and this Order.

9. The appointment of Plaintiffs as the Class Representatives is affirmed.

10. The appointment of Class Counsel is affirmed.

11. The appointment of the Settlement Administrator is affirmed.

12. The Court affirms its findings that the Settlement Class meets the relevant requirements of Florida Rule of Civil Procedure 1.220(a) and (b)(2) and (3), for the purposes of Settlement only, in that: (1) the number of members of the Settlement Class is so numerous that joinder is impracticable; (2) there are questions of law and fact common to the members of the Settlement Class; (3) the claims of the Plaintiffs are typical of the claims of the members of the Settlement Class; (4) the Plaintiffs are adequate representatives for the Settlement Class, and have retained experienced and adequate Class Counsel; (5) the questions of law and fact common to the Settlement Class Members predominate over any questions affecting any individual Settlement Class Members; and (6) a class action is superior to the other available methods for the fair and efficient adjudication of the controversy. In finding the Settlement fair, reasonable, and adequate, the Court has also considered that there were no objections to the Settlement, and only _____ opt-outs, indicating an overwhelming positive reaction from the Settlement Class, and the opinion of competent counsel concerning such matters.

13. Therefore, the Court finally certifies the following Settlement Class:

All living individuals residing in the United States who were sent notice by the Defendant that their Private Information may have been impacted in the Data Incident.

Excluded from the Settlement Class are (a) all persons who are directors, officers, and agents of Defendant; (b) governmental entities; (c) the Judge assigned to the Action, that Judge's immediate family, and Court staff; and (d) any Settlement Class Member who timely and properly opts-out of the Settlement.

14. Judgment shall be, and hereby is, entered dismissing the Action with prejudice, on the merits.

15. Upon the Effective Date, and in consideration of the Settlement relief and other consideration described in the Settlement Agreement, the Releasing Parties shall be deemed to have, and by operation of this Final Approval Order shall have, fully, finally, and irrevocably released the Defendant and the Released Parties from any and all Released Claims

16. Class Counsel is awarded \$400,000.00 for attorneys' fees and costs. Attorneys' fees and costs shall be paid in accordance with the terms of the Agreement. The Court evaluated settlement Class Counsel's request and concludes that amount is fair and within the range of reason.

17. The Class Representatives shall be awarded Service Awards in the amount of \$1,000.00 each. The Service Awards shall be payable in accordance with the Agreement.

18. Plaintiffs and all Settlement Class Members and Releasing Parties, and persons purporting to act on their behalf, are permanently enjoined from commencing or prosecuting (either directly, representatively, or in any other capacity) any of the Released Claims against any of the Released Parties in any action or proceeding in any court, arbitration forum, or tribunal.

19. The Court hereby retains and reserves jurisdiction over: (1) implementation of this Settlement and any distributions to the Settlement Class Members; (2) the Action, until the Effective Date, and until each and every act agreed to be performed by the Parties shall have been performed pursuant to the terms of the Agreement, including the exhibits appended thereto; and (3) all Parties, for the purpose of enforcing and administering the Settlement.

20. In the event the Effective Date of the Settlement does not occur, the Settlement shall be rendered null and void to the extent provided by and in accordance with the Agreement, and this Final Approval Order and any other order entered by this Court in accordance with the terms of the Agreement shall be vacated, *nunc pro tunc*. In such event, all orders entered and

releases delivered in connection with the Settlement shall be null and void and have no further force and effect, shall not be used or referred to for any purpose whatsoever, and shall not be admissible or discoverable in any proceeding. The Action shall return to its status immediately prior to execution of the Agreement.

21. All Settlement Class Members, with the exception of those listed on *Exhibit A*, shall be bound by this Final Approval Order.

22. There being no just reason for delay, the Clerk of Court is hereby directed to enter final judgment forthwith pursuant to Florida Rules of Civil Procedure.
