Re: Notice of Data Event

To Whom It May Concern:

We represent First Harvest Federal Credit Union (“First Harvest”) located at 1617 Hurffville Road Deptford, NJ 08096, and are writing to notify your office of an incident that may affect the security of certain personal information relating to sixteen (16) New Hampshire residents. By providing this notice, First Harvest does not waive any rights or defenses regarding the applicability of New Hampshire law, the applicability of the New Hampshire data event notification statute, or personal jurisdiction.

Nature of the Data Event

On or about February 3, 2026, First Harvest became aware of suspicious activity involving an employee email account and promptly launched an investigation into the nature and scope of the activity. The investigation determined that an unknown actor accessed one email account on January 14, 2026, and potentially accessed certain data within the email account. As a result, First Harvest began working with a third-party to perform a thorough and time-intensive review of the potentially accessed data to determine the types of information contained within and to whom the information belonged. This review recently concluded on April 17, 2026. Although First Harvest has no evidence of any identity theft or fraud in connection with this incident, First Harvest is notifying those individuals whose information was potentially impacted.

The information that could have been subject to unauthorized access includes name, Social Security number, financial account information, and payment card information.

Notice to New Hampshire Residents

On or about May 6, 2026, First Harvest provided written notice of this incident to sixteen (16) New Hampshire residents. Written notice is being provided in substantially the same form as the letter attached here as *Exhibit A*.

Other Steps Taken and To Be Taken

Upon discovering the event, First Harvest moved quickly to investigate and respond to the incident, assess the security of First Harvest's email environment, and identify potentially affected individuals. First Harvest is also working to implement additional safeguards and training to its employees. First Harvest is providing access to credit monitoring services for twelve (12) months, through Kroll, to individuals whose personal information was potentially affected by this incident, at no cost to these individuals.

Additionally, First Harvest is providing impacted individuals with guidance on how to better protect against identity theft and fraud. First Harvest is providing individuals with information on how to place a fraud alert and security freeze on one's credit file, the contact details for the national consumer reporting agencies, information on how to obtain a free credit report, a reminder to remain vigilant for incidents of fraud and identity theft by reviewing account statements and monitoring free credit reports, and encouragement to contact the Federal Trade Commission, their state Attorney General, and law enforcement to report attempted or actual identity theft and fraud.

First Harvest is providing written notice of this incident to relevant state and federal regulators, as necessary, and to the three major credit reporting agencies, Equifax, Experian, and TransUnion.
