

## NOTICE OF PROPOSED CLASS ACTION SETTLEMENT

*Morris, et al., v. Gryphon Healthcare, LLC*

Case No. 2024-77384

District Court for Harris County, Texas

**IF YOUR PRIVATE INFORMATION WAS COMPROMISED IN THE JULY 2024 GRYPHON HEALTHCARE DATA INCIDENT, A PROPOSED CLASS ACTION SETTLEMENT MAY AFFECT YOUR RIGHTS, AND ENTITLE YOU TO BENEFITS AND A CASH PAYMENT.**

*A court has authorized this notice. This is not a solicitation from a lawyer.*

*You are not being sued.*

***Please read this Notice carefully and completely.***

- A Settlement has been reached with Gryphon Healthcare, LLC (“Gryphon” or “Defendant”) in a class action lawsuit. This case is about a targeted cyberattack involving a business associate for which Gryphon provides medical billing services that occurred in or around early July 2024 (the “Data Incident”). Certain files that contained private information were accessed. These files may have contained personal information such as names; dates of birth; addresses; Social Security numbers; dates of service; diagnosis information; health insurance information; medical treatment information; prescription information; provider information and medical record numbers.
- The lawsuit is called *Morris, et al., v. Gryphon Healthcare, LLC*, Case No. 2024-77384. It is pending in the District Court for Harris County, Texas (the “Litigation”).
- Gryphon denies that it did anything wrong, and the Court has not decided who is right.
- The parties have agreed to settle the lawsuit (the “Settlement”) to avoid the costs and risks, disruptions, and uncertainties of continuing the Litigation.
- Gryphon's records indicate that you are a Class Member, and entitled to benefits under the Settlement. You may have received a previous notice directly from Gryphon.
- Your rights are affected whether you act or don’t act. ***Please read this Notice carefully and completely.***

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## Basic Information

### 1. Why was this Notice issued?

The District Court for Harris County, Texas, authorized this Notice. You have a right to know about the proposed Settlement of this class action lawsuit, and about all of your options, before the Court decides whether to grant final approval of the Settlement. This Notice explains the lawsuit, your legal rights, what benefits are available, and who can receive them.

The lawsuit is called *Morris, et al., v. Gryphon Healthcare, LLC*, Case No. 2024-77384. It is pending in the District Court for Harris County, Texas. The people that filed this lawsuit are called the “Plaintiffs” (or “Class Representatives”) and the company they sued, Gryphon Healthcare, LLC, is called the “Defendant.”

### 2. What is this lawsuit about?

This lawsuit alleges that during the July 2024 targeted cyberattack on Gryphon's computer systems, certain files that contained private information were accessed. These files may have contained personal information such as names; dates of birth; addresses; Social Security numbers; dates of service; diagnosis information; health insurance information; medical treatment information; prescription information; provider information and medical record numbers.

### 3. What is a class action?

In a class action, one or more individuals sue on behalf of other people with similar claims. These individuals are called the “Plaintiffs” or “Class Representatives.” Together, the people included in the class action are called a “Class” or “Class Members.” One court resolves the lawsuit for all Class Members, except for those who opt out from the settlement. In this Settlement, the Class Representatives are Danny Wood; Sylvia Cortez; Delaria Cortez; Corey Myers; Ericka Parker as next friend of L.P., a minor; Sarah Smith; Aaron Johnson; Elva Mendoza; and Angela Morris. Everyone included in this Action are the Class Members.

#### 4. Why is there a Settlement?

The Court did not decide whether the Plaintiffs or the Defendant are right. Both sides have agreed to a Settlement to avoid the costs and risks of a trial, and to allow the Class Members to receive benefits from the Settlement. The Plaintiffs and their attorneys think the Settlement is best for all Class Members.

### Who is in the Settlement?

#### 5. Who is included in the Settlement?

The court has defined the Class this way: “All residents of the United States whose Personal Information was potentially exposed in the Data Incident, including all individuals who were sent a breach notification letter.”

#### 6. Are there exceptions to being included?

Yes. Excluded from the Class are: (1) Gryphon and its officers, directors, and related companies; (2) anyone who validly excludes themselves from the Settlement; and (3) the Judge in this case, and the Judge’s family and staff.

### The Settlement Benefits

#### 7. What does the Settlement provide?

Gryphon will establish a Settlement Fund of \$2,800,000.00. The Settlement Fund will first be used to pay the costs of administering the Settlement, court-approved attorneys’ fees and costs, and Service Award payments for the Plaintiffs. The net remaining money will be used to pay for the benefits described below.

All Class Members may enroll in two years of **Identity Theft Protection and Medical Data Monitoring**, and **one** of two payment options:

**Out-of-Pocket Losses.** If you incurred actual, documented out-of-pocket losses due to the Data Incident, you can get back up to **\$5,000.00**.

OR

**Cash Payment.** Instead of reimbursement for out-of-pocket losses, you may claim a cash payment estimated to be **\$100.00** (subject to increase or decrease based on the number of claims filed). You do not have to provide any proof or explanation to claim this payment.

The benefits are explained in more detail below.

**Identity Theft Protection and Medical Data Monitoring.** Class Members who submit valid claims may enroll in two years of CyEx Medical Shield Complete. This comprehensive service comes with \$1 million of medical identity theft insurance, and includes monitoring for:

- healthcare insurance ID exposure
- Medical Record Number (MRN) exposure
- unauthorized Health Savings Account (HSA) spending

If anything suspicious happens, you will be able to talk to a fraud resolution agent to help fix any problems.

**Out-of-Pocket Losses.** If you incurred actual, documented out-of-pocket losses due to the Data Incident, you can get back up to **\$5,000.00**.

This benefit covers out-of-pocket expenses like:

- losses because of identity theft or fraud
- fees for credit reports, credit monitoring, or freezing and unfreezing your credit
- cost to replace your IDs
- postage to contact banks by mail

You need to send proof, like bank statements or receipts, to show how much you spent or lost. You can also send notes or papers you made yourself to explain or support other proof, but those notes or papers alone are not enough to make a valid claim. Your proof or notes should show that your expenses were because of the Data Incident.

You cannot claim a payment for expenses that have already been reimbursed by a third party.

**Cash Payment.** Instead of reimbursement for out-of-pocket losses, you may claim a cash payment, estimated at **\$100** per person. This payment may be larger or smaller depending on the total claims filed. You do not have to provide any proof or explanation to claim this payment.

## 8. What claims am I releasing if I stay in the Class?

If you stay in the class, you won't be able to be part of any other lawsuit against Gryphon about the issues that this Settlement covers. The "Releases" section of the Settlement Agreement (Section 9) describes the legal claims that you give up if you remain in the Class. ## Submitting a Claim Form for a Settlement Payment

### 9. How do I submit a claim for a Settlement benefit?

### 10. Are there any important Settlement payment deadlines?

If you are submitting a Claim Form online, you must do so by **April 16, 2026**. If you are submitting a claim by U.S. mail, the completed and signed Claim Form, including supporting documentation, must be postmarked no later than **April 16, 2026**.

### 11. When will the Settlement benefits be issued?

The Court will hold a final approval hearing on **August 31, 2026 (see Question 18)**. If the Court approves the Settlement, there may be appeals. We do not know if appeals will be filed, or how long it will take to resolve them if they are filed.

Settlement payments will be distributed if the Court grants final approval, and after any appeals are resolved.

## The Lawyers Representing You

### 12. Do I have a lawyer in the case?

Yes, the Court has appointed attorneys Gary M. Klinger of Milberg Coleman Bryson Phillips Grossman; A. Brooke Murphy of Murphy Law Firm; and Tyler J. Bean of Siri & Glimstad LLP, to represent you and other Class Members ("Class Counsel").

### 13. Should I get my own lawyer?

You will not be charged for Class Counsel's services. If you want your own lawyer, you may hire one at your expense.

### 14. How will Class Counsel be paid?

Class Counsel will ask the court to approve reasonable attorneys' fees not to exceed one-third (1/3) of the Settlement Fund plus reimbursement of litigation expenses.

Class Counsel will also ask for Service Award payments of \$2,500.00 for each of the Class Representatives.

These amounts will be paid from the Settlement Fund.

## Excluding Yourself from the Settlement

### 15. How do I opt out of the Settlement?

If you do not want to be part of the Settlement, you must formally exclude yourself from the Settlement. This is called a Request for Exclusion, and is sometimes also called “opting out.” If you opt out, you will not receive Settlement benefits or payment. However, you will keep any rights you may have to sue Gryphon on your own about the legal issues in this case.

If you exclude yourself, you are telling the Court that you do not want to be part of the Settlement. You will not be eligible to receive any Settlement benefits if you exclude yourself.

The deadline to exclude yourself from the Settlement is **March 17, 2026**.

To be valid, your Request for Exclusion must have the following information:

- (1) the name of the Litigation: *Morris, et al., v. Gryphon Healthcare, LLC*, Case No. 2024-77384, pending in the District Court for Harris County, Texas;
- (2) your full name, mailing address, telephone number, and email address;
- (3) personal signature; and
- (4) the words “Request for Exclusion” or a clear and similar statement that you do not want to participate in the Settlement.

You may only exclude yourself—not any other person.

Your Request for Exclusion must be postmarked by **March 17, 2026**.

## Commenting on or Objecting to the Settlement

### 16. How do I tell the Court if I like or do not like the Settlement?

If you are a Class Member and do not like part or all of the Settlement, you can object to it. Objecting means telling the Court your reasons for why you think the Court should not approve the Settlement. The Court will consider your views.

You cannot object if you have excluded yourself from the Settlement (**see Question 15**)

You must provide the following information for the Court to consider your objection:

- (1) the name of the Litigation: *Morris, et al., v. Gryphon Healthcare, LLC*, Case No. 2024-77384, pending in the District Court for Harris County, Texas;
- (2) your full name, mailing address, telephone number, and email address;
- (3) a clear description of all the reasons you object; include any legal support, such as documents, you may have for your objection;
- (4) if you have hired your own lawyer to represent you for this objection, provide their name, bar number, and contact information;
- (5) if you or your lawyer have objected in any other cases in the past three years, list the names, courts, and civil action numbers for each of those cases;
- (6) if you plan on calling witnesses or submitting documents at the Final Approval Hearing, provide a full list of both;
- (7) your signature (or, if you have hired your own lawyer, your lawyer's signature).

For your objection to be valid, it must meet each of these requirements.

To be considered by the Court, you must file your complete objection with the Clerk of Court by **March 17, 2026**. You must also send a copy of the objection to the Settlement Administrator, Class Counsel, and counsel for Defendants.

### 17. What is the difference between objecting and excluding?

Objecting is telling the Court that you do not like something about the Settlement. You can object to the Settlement only if you do not exclude yourself from the Settlement. Excluding yourself from the Settlement is opting out and stating to the Court that you do not want to be part of the Settlement. If you opt out of the Settlement, you cannot object to it because the Settlement no longer affects you.

## The Court's Final Approval Hearing

### 18. When is the Court's Final Approval Hearing?

The Court will hold a final approval on **August 31, 2026, at 1:30pm Central Time**, at the District Court for Harris County, Texas, **1201 Franklin Street, Houston, TX 77002**.

At the final approval hearing, the Court will decide whether to approve the Settlement. The court will also decide how Class Counsel should be paid, and whether to award Service Award payments to the Class Representatives. The Court will also consider any objections to the Settlement.

If you are a Class Member, you or your lawyer may ask permission to speak at the hearing at your own cost (**See Question 16**).

The date and time of this hearing may change without further notice. Please check **[www.GryphonHealthcareDataSettlement.com](http://www.GryphonHealthcareDataSettlement.com)** for updates.

### 19. Do I have to come to the Final Approval Hearing?

No. Class Counsel will answer any questions the Court may have. You may attend at your own expense if you wish, but you do not have to.

If you file an objection, you do not have to come to the Final Approval Hearing to talk about it; the Court will consider it as long as it was filed on time. You may also pay your own lawyer to attend, but you do not have to.

## If I Do Nothing

### 20. What happens if I do nothing at all?

If you do nothing, you will not receive a benefit from this Settlement.

You will also give up the rights described in **Question 8**.
