Dear Sir/Madam:

On behalf of MasTec, an American infrastructure and construction company based in Florida, I am writing to inform your office about a security event that affected 18 New Hampshire residents. We were the victim of an attack that exploited a zero-day vulnerability in one of our third-party solutions. The event involved unauthorized activity on a limited portion of our network. We promptly began working with cybersecurity experts to investigate and determine the impacted data. On June 5, 2026, we are mailing notice to affected individuals.

In early October 2025, we received a report from our endpoint detection and response provider about suspicious activity affecting one of our third-party solutions. We promptly initiated a response, including deploying the applicable patch to address the zero-day vulnerability. We also engaged outside counsel, and they in turn retained cybersecurity experts to conduct a forensic investigation. The investigation identified impacted data, and we quickly pivoted to staging those files. Once we finished staging the files, our outside counsel promptly engaged a data-review vendor to analyze the contents of those files.

The data-review vendor shared their report with our outside counsel in February 2026. The report identified that the following types of personal information were impacted: names, birthdates, addresses, financial account details, Social Security numbers, and limited account credentials. Upon receiving those results, our outside counsel promptly began reviewing the impacted data to advise us on our notification obligations. We then worked with a mailing vendor to update contact information for impacted individuals and completed that process on April 23, 2026. We are mailing notices to impacted individuals on June 5, 2026.

We have included templates of the notices we are mailing. Those notices include 12 months of complimentary credit monitoring for any individual with a Social Security number impacted by the event.

In addition to conducting a forensic investigation and notifying affected individuals, we have worked diligently to bolster our cybersecurity measures. For example, we promptly applied the patch to address the zero-day vulnerability. We also continue to employ robust cybersecurity safeguards and training.
