Re: Notice of Data Event

To Whom It May Concern:

We represent Time Equities, Inc. ("TEI"), located at 55 5th Avenue, New York, NY 10003, and are writing to notify your office of an incident that may affect the security of certain personal information relating to approximately 26 New Hampshire residents. This notice may be supplemented with any new significant facts learned subsequent to its submission. By providing this notice, TEI does not waive any rights or defenses regarding the applicability of New Hampshire law, the applicability of the New Hampshire data event notification statute, or personal jurisdiction.

1. Nature of the Data Event

On April 24, 2026, we discovered that certain personal information of certain individuals was potentially impacted as the result of suspicious email activity initially learned of on October 16, 2025. We immediately initiated an investigation of the matter and engaged cybersecurity experts to assist with the process. As a result of the investigation, we determined that certain files may have been accessed and acquired without authorization on October 16, 2025. We then undertook a comprehensive review of those files and learned that certain personal information was contained within the potentially affected data. This review was completed on April 24, 2026. Please note that we do not have any evidence of the misuse, or attempted misuse, of any potentially impacted information.

The information that could have been subject to unauthorized access includes first and last name, as well as Social Security number and driver's license number.

2. Notice to New Hampshire Residents

On or about April 30, 2026, TEI provided written notice of this incident to approximately 26 New Hampshire residents. Written notice is being provided in substantially the same form as the letter attached here as **Exhibit A**.

3. Other Steps Taken and To Be Taken

Upon discovering the event, TEI moved quickly to investigate and respond to the incident, assess the security of its network, and identify potentially affected individuals. Further, TEI notified the Federal Bureau of Investigation regarding the event. TEI is providing access to credit monitoring services for twelve (12) months through TransUnion to individuals whose personal information was potentially affected by this incident, at no cost to these individuals.

Additionally, TEI is providing impacted individuals with guidance on how to better protect against identity theft and fraud, including advising individuals to report any suspected incidents of identity theft or fraud to their credit card company and/or bank. TEI is providing individuals with information on how to place a fraud alert and security freeze on one's credit file, information on protecting against tax fraud, the contact details for the national consumer reporting agencies, information on how to obtain a free credit report, a reminder to remain vigilant for incidents of fraud and identity theft by reviewing account statements and monitoring free credit reports, and encouragement to contact the Federal Trade Commission, their state Attorney General, and law enforcement to report attempted or actual identity theft and fraud.
